Greetings Edmore Patrons:

The students of Edmore are busy preparing for spring activities. Co-curricular competitions including Acalymics and music events allow students to show off their cognitive and musical talents. The Edmore students placed 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Acalymic competition. It should be noted that competing schools had their students practicing for the competition weeks before the event. The Edmore students were selected a week before the competition and did not practice before hand. Kudos to our students for their achievement at these events.

### **North Dakota State Assessment vs. ACT**

This past year North Dakota administrators along the Department of Public Instruction processed the issue of allowing local school districts to substitute the college entrance exam (ACT) for the North Dakota State Assessment (NDSA). At the end of the day of the 173 school North Dakota school districts 14 districts chose to substitute the ACT for the NDSA. Edmore was not one of these districts. The rationale for this decision was the following: Although substituting the ACT for the NDSA would result in one less assessment for students to take the ACT, it is not aligned with the North Dakota state standards and is truly a college entrance exam. The NDSA is aligned to the North Dakota state standards and is aligned with Edmore's K12 curriculum. Our staff develop curriculum maps for each grade based on the North Dakota standards and weekly lesson plans and daily lessons are implemented for students to master these standards. The NDSA is one measure we utilize to gauge if our students are mastering the state standards. It is also utilized as one of several measurements for instructional effectiveness. The Edmore staff also utilize the STAR360 assessment and also classroom formative assessments (teacher assignments, assessments, and observations). This year the NDSA will be given electronically (on computer) rather than paper/pencil. The Edmore administration and staff will continue to monitor our curriculum and instructional programs and make adjustments based on research and best practices.

### **School Accountability Reports**

Recent federal legislation has replaced No Child Left Behind (NCLB) with the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The intent of the federal legislation was to move education decision making from the federal level to the individual state level. Although this sounds good when listening to the news, the reality is that each state still needs to submit their individual plan to the federal level for approval. Local districts are still bound to state century code which greatly limits the ability for a district to make program adjustments at the local level.

As a result of the ESSA legislation the NCLB district report card will soon be replaced by School Accountability Reports. This report will be on line and available for the public to view data associated with each school district. We will let you know when this accountability report is available for viewing.

In closing, the school board, administration, and staff continue to remain committed to provide a nurturing culture for our students to thrive both academically and socially. We continue to thank the Edmore School District patrons for their continued support of education.

Our students in grades **3-8** and **10** will be taking our state assessment test, the AIR Assessment (American Institutes for Research). This is the first year the 10<sup>th</sup> graders will be taking the test instead of the 11<sup>th</sup> grade and we will be using the computer instead of paper/pencil. This test is mandated by our state for students to take in the spring of each year. The questions on these tests are a review of the standards that the students have been doing all year in English and math. To show how much students really know, it is important that they try their best. We have set aside the weeks of **April 16 - April 26<sup>th</sup>** for testing to occur. We encourage parents and children to read and talk about the test taking suggestions listed below.

### Getting Ready...

- Get plenty of sleep the night before the test.
- Eat a healthy breakfast. This will give your brain the energy it needs to do your very best.
- Come to school on time and with the tools that you need. Do you need your glasses?
- Have a positive attitude. Remind yourself that you've studied hard and that you are ready.

### Knowing What To Do...

- Read all the directions. If you don't understand what you are supposed to do, ask your teacher to re-read the directions.
- Read the questions carefully and all of the possible answer choices. Remember that you are looking for the best answer choice.
- Try to eliminate some of the answer choices. *Which are the ones that just do not make sense?* Then choose your answer from the remaining choices.

### The Test...

- **Use your scratch paper!** You will be working on your own during the test and it helps to figure things out on paper.
- **The test questions are not in any order.** Some will be hard and some will be easy. Even if they seem hard keep going.
- **The answers are not in a pattern.** Do not try to mark a certain number of A's, B's, C's, D's, or E's, or feel that one answer choice would not be correct if you used it on the question before.
- **Try to find the best answer for each question.** Even if you're not sure, mark the one that you think would be best.

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The Culture Fair is a interdisciplinary project that is done with students in 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> grade. The project has different elements for ELA, Food and Nutrition, and social studies, yet they mesh together to form the end result: THE CULTURE FAIR. While the entire project looks daunting, the teachers split it up into smaller, more manageable tasks. Each year the teachers reflect on the project as a whole and make changes they feel will benefit the students. This is, by no means, perfect, but it has proved to be a fantastic way to showcase learning. We will continue reflecting, redoing, adding, subtracting, and integrating elements to fit standards, interests, and students.

This year the Culture Fair was a little different from last year -

1. 6th and 7th graders did Ancient Civilizations instead of countries (to follow the state standards)
2. We did it in March instead of the typical time in October
3. We experimented with a smaller audience

We had a great time. The students were able to showcase all the research and learning they did in ELA, social studies, and Food and Nutrition. Culture Fair has become a yearly event in the school, I love being able to watch the kids show off how much work they put into class. BRAVO!

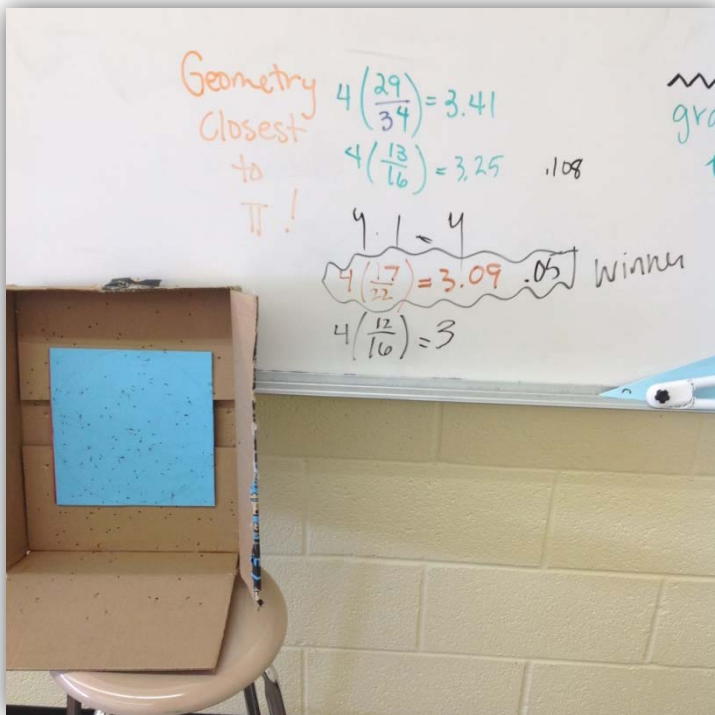

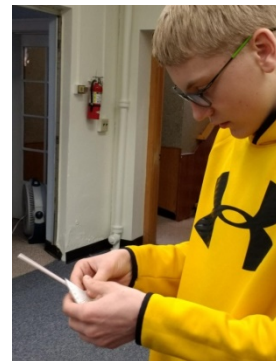
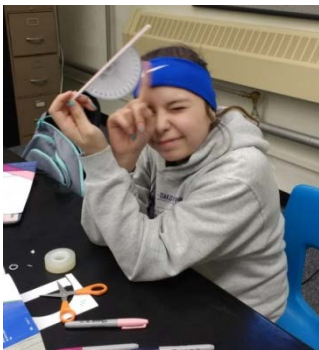

# Science with Mr. Metz

Advanced Chemistry - Just finished Chemical Kinetics now Working on Equalibrium Reactions and calculations in chemistry. Getting out those quadratic equations to work some problems

Chemistry - Finished up Gas Laws and Gas Law calculations. Working now on molarity - calculations on solutions - how does adding a solute affect melting point and boiling point - In the real world why do we throw salt on a sidewalk to melt ice or why do we add salt water to cook pasta?

Earth and Space – Just finished up on weather- starting Astronomy -Students just finished presentations on famous astronomers in development of astronomy. Ask your child - What is red shift and the Doppler effect? Here we made astrolabes - a simple tool to record the position of a star in the night sky



6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade General Science

Also finished up weather and started on the Earth, the Moon and the Sun. Looking at tools of astronomers, Time and time zones and Moon Phases.

Anatomy and Physiology - Just finished the endocrine system. We started the study of blood and the circulatory system with student presented notes on components of blood. We will soon be working on Veins, arteries and the circulatory system.

We have great students here at Edmore learning a lot of Science!

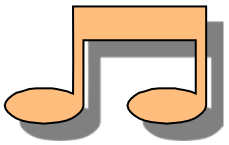
