Greetings Parents/Guardians:

The fall season has been short-lived as we experienced an early snowfall and wet conditions thus making it difficult for farmers to get the crop off this year. It is coincidental, but the school board voted to lower the mill rate to operate the school this year which should result in lower requested dollars from the Edmore school district patrons. Each year the school board examines the budget and attempts to be as frugal as possible while still offering a quality education to our youth and remaining competitive regarding salaries to attract and retain quality staff.

This past summer the district has continued to maintain and improve staff housing and update the kitchen. Improvements to staff housing included siding, windows, and doors to several residences. Monies utilized for facility improvements come from the building fund. Per century code monies from this fund are very restrictive and cannot be transferred to the general fund for the daily operation costs of the district. As a result of these restrictions the board has reduced the building fund levy to zero and will begin to utilize the existing funds to continue to maintain and update the existing facility.

Legislative Interim Committee

At the end of the 2019 legislative session an education interim committee was formed to study and bring recommendations to the 2021 legislative assembly regarding school funding. One area the committee is examining is the school funding formula. At the present time approximately half the public K12 schools in North Dakota are not on the formula. It appears that the goal of the legislature is to move all schools onto the formula and continue to strive for equity and adequacy in K12 funding for schools. The effects for many schools, including Edmore, will be less funding coming from the State. At the present time it appears that a reduction in funding will be transitional (possibly over 5 years) rather than occur rapidly, but the end result would be less money for the Edmore school district. The Edmore school board continues to examine student enrollment and finances. They will continue to solicit input from parents and patrons regarding the state of the district. It should be noted that Edmore students continue to achieve above the State average and continue to receive an excellent education. The school board sets high expectations for staff and students and the result of these expectations is high student achievement.

On behalf of the Edmore school board, staff, and students, we would like to thank the Edmore patrons for their continued support.

November Newsletter-2nd and 3rd Grade

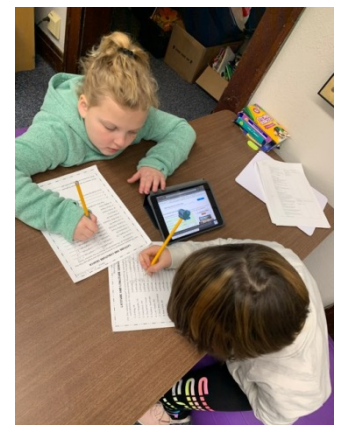
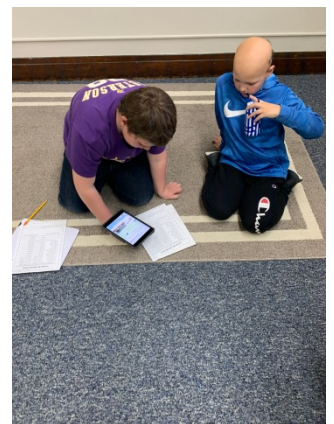
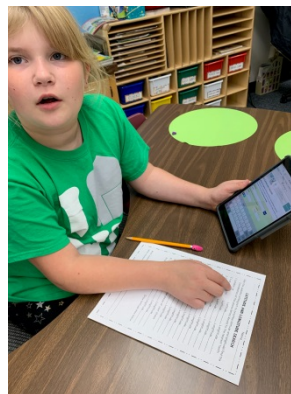
In Second Grade ELA, we have been focusing on different story genres. Some genres we've covered have been informational, folktales, and realistic fiction. We have been learning all about word endings, digraphs, and consonant and vowel patterns. We have also been focusing on common and proper nouns, singular and plural nouns, and verbs and their tenses! In Second Grade Math, we have been working with measurement! We have learned how to measure line segments, as well as objects around the room!

In Third Grade ELA, the students have covered genres such as folktales, narrative nonfiction, and informational. They've been working on identifying silent letters, letter clusters, base-endings, and vowel and consonant patterns. In Math, they have been focusing on adding and subtracting money, regrouping with subtraction, calendar, and time problems! We will be learning all about measurement, estimating and rounding, and reading clocks to the nearest minute! We also got to welcome a new classmate, Tristen! We are so happy he's with us!

In social studies we have been learning a lot about latitude and longitude! The students got the chance to use a website to find the latitude and longitude of designated areas. We will be playing a game of latitude and longitude battleship to progress on the skill. Students will also be creating their own water park, which will result in them creating maps for the areas!

In Science we have been working with forces. Students have been identifying what kind of movements result in a push force or pull force. Next, we will cover motion!

Students got the chance to visit the pumpkin patch. It was a blast! There were tricycle races, trail walks, and a petting area! We are so excited for what's to come in November!



News from the 5th Graders

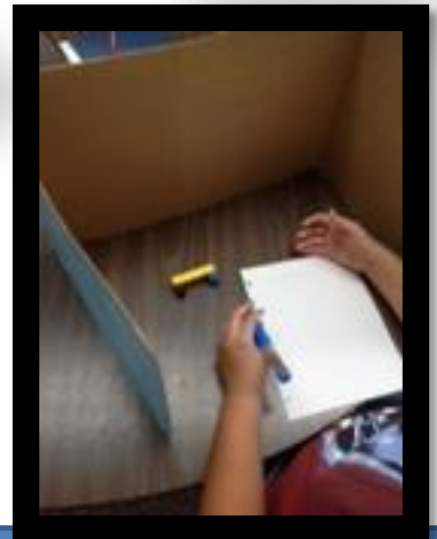
Pumpkin Patch

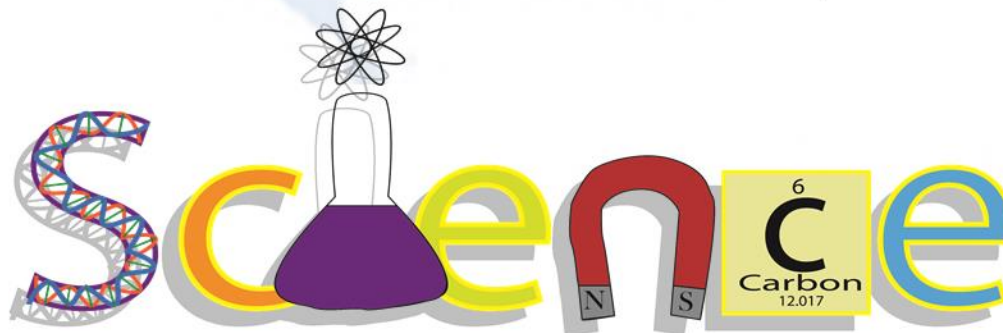

8th, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II

Ms. Ganyo's Math

Linear and Quadratic functions

Algebra II (11th grade) Much of our time is spent investigating the relationship between quantities. During our recent studies we have been focused relationships that are represented by graphs of lines, circles and parabolas (u-shaped structures).

Algebra II students will use their knowledge of linear, quadratic and parabolic equations to create the ultimate roller coasters in our Roller

Coaster Engineer project! These projects will be created as profile view of the roller coaster in order to display the necessary elements for these crazy, twisting contraptions.

Algebra I (9th grade) Our time has

been spent reviewing and building our knowledge of linear equations and we are now moving into systems of equations which is rich in application in every career field. New formulas and their use will be put to work as we finish up our unit with a project involving an archeological dig and Vornoi diagrams which are also used to plot the paths of robots in fully automated factories.

Parallel Lines, Transversals & Angle Relationships

Geometry (10th grade) and 8th Grade Math

We are studying parallel and perpendicular lines and their importance in our everyday world. These geometric concepts are vital in building stable structures, creating beautiful and lasting furniture, or finding efficient methods for packaging products for shipment.

We have learned that common structures in our homes represent parallel lines (studs in the walls, railings, etc.), and the lines created by our walls and floors provide the most stability.

Students will put their line and angle relationship skills to the test when they plan and design their own 'tiny town'. Each student will be given a list of

'must have' features to include in their design. Please look for these projects as we move into November.

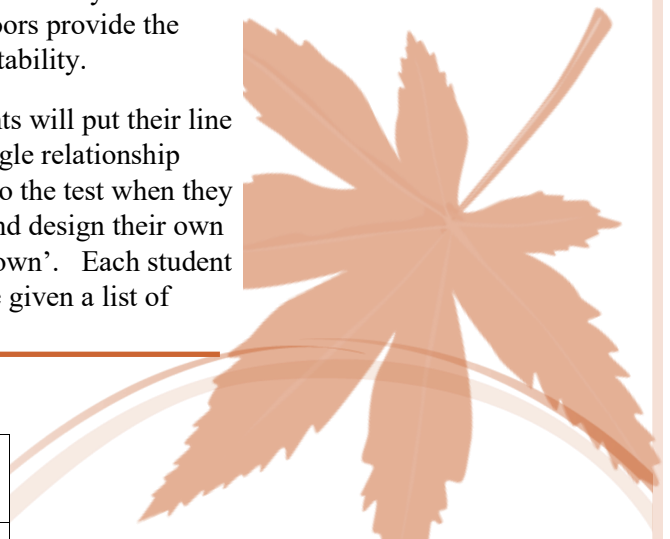

Quarter 1 has come to an end. It was a great way to begin the year!

Geography 9/10: This quarter we really focused on laying a strong geography foundation. We studied geographical terms, maps, landforms, and elements of culture. Now, we will be looking at individual countries and regions where we will use those skills to help us break down and understand a region's culture. Our next project is the CULTURE FAIR! So keep on the lookout for information on that. Students will be researching this month and putting everything together next month.

Ancient History 6/7: Our first task was making sure students understood why we study history. Once we established that we jumped right in. Ancient history focuses on ancient cultures and their impact on the world. We have completed the study of Mesopotamia and kingdoms around the Nile in Egypt. We have all learned so much – from settlement patterns to how people were mummified. November we are looking at India and their impact on the world.

 - Burial practices of Egyptians

ND Studies 8: North Dakota history is required for all 8th graders. This year, we are using the online curriculum found at ndstudies.gov. Students have access to the book 24/7 through their computers. Since I got a new board in my room we have really utilized a lot of the features in this class. We go over the text together and examine pictures as a group. We are learning so many new things about ND – like how the capital was moved from Yankton to Bismarck or how the reservations were created and how they got their final boundaries.

 - How views of surveyors, scholars, and trappers impacted settlement
 - Extreme weather and how ND deals with it
 - Creation and development of the ND reservations
 - Alexander McKenzie and how he pulled off the changing of the capital city

United States History 11/12: History has always been one of my favorite subjects to teach, there is always a great story that goes along with any significant event. After completing the industrial revolution and a unit on WWI we are focusing on the Roaring Twenties and soon we will jump into WWII, which we will study until about Christmas break.

- Things to quiz your student on:
 - The role the US played in WWI
 - How industrialization changed the US
 - How women's lives changed from the early 1900s
