Kindergarten Standards for the above lessons:

Counting objects, say number names in standard order, paring each object with one and only one number names and each number name with one and only one object.

Understand that the last number name said tells the number of objects counted, regardless of the order in which they were counted.

Count to answer how many. (1-20 objects)

Write numbers from 0-20 with written numeral.

Identify whether the number of objects in one group is greater than, less than, or equal to the number of objects in another group
